- The camp's on-call physician is Dr. Kristen Xeller, MD, from the Family Medicine, Pomfret Center, CT.
- The Rectory Infirmary will be available for non-emergency medical care at the camp.
- In an emergency, 911 will be called for transportation to the hospital.
- Staff members/clients will be transported with copies of their medical records as well as the signed DKH consent form.
- DKH should refer to each staff member/client's records for their specific insurance carriers.
