




At Rectory School, we believe in our students

...inspiring lifelong learners

CORE CLASSES provide students opportunities to learn in an engaging and dynamic learning environment. Students develop creativity, critical thinking, communication, and collaboration skills while building confidence, character, and the ability to advocate for themselves through the lens of brain-based learning. Our students develop an understanding of how they learn best and are able to implement strategies that support their learning.

Classes include: Computer Science, Effective Speaking & Writing, Electives, English, Enrichment, Health & Wellness, History, Individual Instruction Program (IIP) or Study Hall, Math, Performing Arts, Related Arts, Science, Skill Block.

ADVISORY meets three times a week and supports students academically, emotionally, and socially. Advisors serve as our students' primary advocates and are the first point of contact for parents. Through frequent in-school meetings, advisors develop strong relationships with their advisees and an understanding of their students' strengths and support needs. Best of all, students know they can consult their advisors about all areas of school life.

ELECTIVES provide our students an exploratory experience in a variety of disciplines such as robotics, nature writing, yearbook, orchestra, student newspaper, chorus, and drama. We encourage our students to explore their interests and passions.

ENRICHMENT provides time twice a week for students to meet with their teachers for academic support or enrichment.

HEALTH & WELLNESS teaches students about healthy living, including mental, emotional, social, and physical health. The Health and Wellness curriculum helps students develop skills in self-awareness and empathy for others through goal setting, teamwork, and communication exercises. Students will learn to make informed decisions about the challenges and choices they face as they develop into young adults while keeping responsibility, respect, honesty, and compassion in mind.

SKILL BLOCK helps students develop and grow the skills that support success in the classroom. These skills include organization, planning and prioritizing, self-advocacy, and communication.


INDIVIDUALIZED INSTRUCTION PROGRAM (IIP)

A pioneer among junior boarding schools in individualized instruction, Rectory has provided students with one-to-one instruction as an integral part of our educational environment since our founding in 1920. Rectory's Individualized Instruction Program (IIP) celebrates the uniqueness of each student and is designed to address a range of academic needs (remediation and enrichment) with seamless integration into the academic day. A majority of our IIP teachers have advanced degrees and/or specialized certifications.

IIP AREAS OF FOCUS INCLUDE:

- EXECUTIVE FUNCTIONING (including organization, planning, prioritizing, and time management)
- ADD & ADHD
- ACADEMIC SUPPORT

- DYSLEXIA (Orton Gillingham or Wilson approaches)
- ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT
- ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNING (ELL)



MARCH EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING PROGRAM (MELP)

Our signature MELP program provides alternative learning through creativity and problem solving. A myriad of different programs take place during the first week of the spring term and offer students an opportunity to explore creative, hands-on learning outside of the classroom. Community Service forms part of each MELP experience; students volunteer at charter schools, food pantries, soup kitchens, and participate in beach cleanups.

Some great MELP adventures have included: Arizona: Salt River Rafting; Atlanta: Empire City of The South; California: Lights, Camera, Action; How It's Made; Inside New England Sports; Key Largo: Unlocking the Everglades; Nashville: America's Music City; Orlando: Animation, Imagination, and Innovation; Outdoor Adventures; Washington D.C.: Our Nation's Treasures.




...promoting teamwork & sportsmanship


...preparing strong leaders & confident individuals

THE NINTH-GRADE YEAR instills the attributes critical for success at the secondary level: leadership, confidence, and perseverance. Leadership opportunities, such as dorm proctor, athletic team captain, or running for student government, enable our 9th graders to examine who they are and what they can accomplish as young adults, while a rigorous and dynamic curriculum prepares them for secondary schools that are among the most recognized in the nation.

Trust and camaraderie are nurtured in a whole-group setting, with activities such as our fall all-day leadership camp and spring adventure park challenge, making the final year an unforgettable and lasting experience for the entire class.

THE NINTH-GRADE CAPSTONE PROJECT provides an opportunity for our students to explore and consider solutions to issues that are present in today's society. Ninth-graders are paired with a faculty Capstone Leader who provides guidance throughout the process of selecting a topic, researching, writing an essay, and crafting an informational poster. Culminating with the Capstone Fair, faculty, students, and outside visitors are invited to view and discuss these projects with the students.

RECTORY GRADUATION is the culmination of the 9th-grade experience, where our students are recognized for their individual efforts, receive their diplomas, and proudly and confidently enter the world as Rectory alumni.
